Background

Amid growing concerns that climate change will affect international peace and security, over the last ten years the issue has emerged on a regular basis on the agenda of the UN Security Council. While important normative improvements have been made, more can be done for the Council to take meaningful action on climate change-related challenges. The Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung New York (FES New York) has commissioned the publication "Climate Change and Global Security: What Role for the UN Security Council". The authors analyze whether action on climate change could trigger transformation of the Council into an organ better suited for the world's 21st century challenges in general. They offer a number of forward-looking reform proposals to position the Council as reinforcing the UN's system-wide response to climate change rather than encroaching on it.
